The admission requirements for Diploma studies at Peritum Agri Institute have been promulgated at a College Council meeting dated May 2017 and comprises the following:

Admission is granted to students who possess an NQF Level 4 qualification (National Senior Certificate, National Certificate (Vocational), or Equivalent), and who meets the following minimum requirements:

1. achieved 40% in Mathematics, or 40% in Mathematics Literacy, or Economics 40% or Accounting 40%
2. achieved 40% in English First Additional Language

The successful completion of bridging courses widens access to the programme for students who marginally miss the minimum entry requirements in 1. and or 2. (above).
